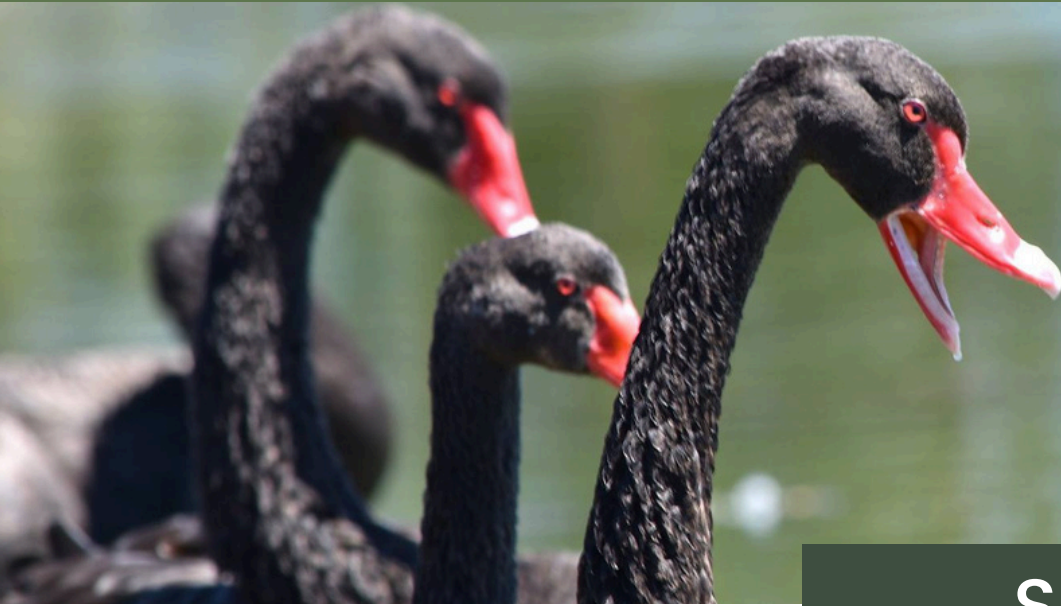

SEASON OF MAKURU

Entering Makuru means we are entering the coldest and wettest time of the year.

Traditionally this was the time of year for the Nyoongar people to migrate inland to find shelter.

Food consisted of fattier red-meat animals; the yonga (kangaroo) and weitj (emu) were hunted at this time of year and used as bookas (food and clothing) to help ward off the cold.

Swans return to the lake and here at Lake Gwelup the rising lake levels are welcomed.

Join the Friends of Lake Gwelup for a morning of community and conservation.

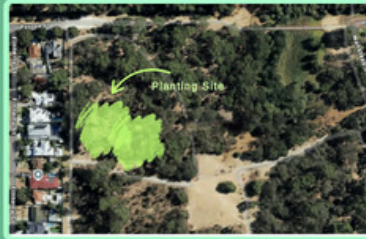
Together, we will be planting 550 native flowering seedlings to benefit wildlife and the ecosystem.
